	The £1m cap on business and agricultural relief announced in the October 2024 Budget was extremely unwelcome. At the time of writing some details are unclear. A technical document was published by HMRC in early 2025 providing some details of how the reliefs will apply to transfers into trusts.
	For elderly taxpayers who had used AIM shares as part of their IHT planning, the reduction in the rate of relief to 50% was a blow, compounded by the inclusion of undrawn pension pots in the IHT estate
	This session will look at the implications of the changes and what if anything taxpayers can do.
